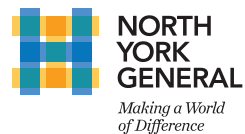

Dr. Arun Sayal

Dr. Catherine Zahn

Recognition includes appointment as a Member of the Order of Canada, and the U of T Faculty of Medicine Lifetime Achievement Award.

Dr. Howard Ovens



Howard Ovens is a staff emergency physician at Mount Sinai Hospital and the Chief Medical Strategy Officer of Sinai Health, and Medical Advisor to Sinai Health Foundation.. At the University of Toronto he holds the rank of Full Professor at the Dept. of Family and Community Medicine and is a Senior Fellow in the Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation. He is the Ontario Expert Lead for Emergency Medicine; in that capacity he co-leads the Provincial Emergency Services program for Ontario Health and co-chairs the Emergency Services Advisory Committee. He is also a member of the Public Affairs Committee of the Canadian Association of Emergency Physicians; he tweets about issues in the administration of and public policy related to emergency services using the handle @HowardOvens and his blog "Waiting to be seen" is hosted on the Emergency Medicine Cases website.

Dr. Kevin Wasko



Dr. Kevin Wasko is the Chief of Emergency Medicine and Program Medical Director at North York General Hospital in Toronto, ON. Prior to joining NYGH, he was a practicing emergency physician with Trillium Health Partners in Mississauga, ON. He served as the Physician Executive for Integrated Rural Health with the Saskatchewan Health Authority from December 2017 until June 2022, holding joint responsibility for the delivery of healthcare services across rural Saskatchewan. Dr. Wasko is a graduate of the University of Calgary's Cumming School of Medicine. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in political science from Dalhousie University, a Master of Arts in political science from the University of Calgary, and a certificate of added competence in Emergency Medicine (CCFP-EM).

Dr. Dan Cass is a two-time graduate of the University of Toronto, receiving his BSc in 1984 and MD in 1988 before completing the Royal College Residency Program in Emergency Medicine in Toronto in 1993. He worked as a staff Emergency Physician at St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto for 16 years, from 1993 to 2009, for 10 of which he was Chief of Emergency Medicine. Dr. Christenson is a professor in the Department of Emergency Medicine at the University of British Columbia and a researcher at Providence Health Care. He practiced Emergency Medicine for 38 years in Vancouver, combined with teaching and research. Among other leadership positions, he served as the Emergency Medicine Research Director for Providence Health Care, Vice President of Medical Care with the BC Ambulance Service and inaugural Head of the Department of Emergency Medicine at UBC. Presently he is the chair of the Resuscitation Advisory Committee for the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, Chair of the International Advisory Board for the Schwartz Reisman Emergency Medicine Institute and Senior Medical Advisor to Emergency Care BC. His current research interests include improving survival from out of hospital sudden unexpected death, early neuroprotection in severe ischemic stroke and improving emergency care in remote indigenous nations.

Dr. Tamara McColl



Tamara McColl is a clinician educator, Assistant Professor and Director of Education Scholarship and Faculty Development within the Department of Emergency Medicine at the University of Manitoba. She is the Chair of the Royal College Specialty Committee for Emergency Medicine, sits on the Board of Directors for the Canadian Association of Emergency Physicians (CAEP) and is the Chair of the CAEP Education Scholars Committee. Dr. McColl engages in research focused primarily on competency based medical education, education innovations, and EDI.

Eddy Lang is a Professor and Department Head for Emergency Medicine at Cumming School of Medicine- University of Calgary and Alberta Health Services, Calgary Zone. His areas of interest are knowledge translation, evidence-based medicine and operations research. He is a member of the GRADE working group and has led the development of GRADE-based clinical practice guidelines in pre-hospital care in the US as well as with the International Liaison Committee for Resuscitation. Dr. Lang is also an award-winning educator having received recognition at both the university, national and international levels. He also serves as Senior Editor for the Canadian Journal of Emergency Medicine, Associate Editor for both ACP Journal Club and the International Journal of Emergency Medicine. In addition, he is a member of the Canadian Task Force on Preventive Health Care (CTFPHC). He was also inducted as a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences in 2022 and became a certificant of the Canadian College of Physician Executives in the same year.
